Questions to Ask:


Where are the first humans thought to originate from?

What did these humans worship?

What did these humans invent?

Why were these humans considered nomads?

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Fossils are hardened remains or imprints of living things that existed long ago. The oldest fossils were found in **Africa**.



Early African civilizations were hunter-gatherers. The men were responsible for the hunting, and the women were responsible for the gathering. They were also nomads, which means they traveled from place to place in search of food.

1959 Human fossils found at Olduvai


1974 "Lucy" discovered in Ethiopia
